The World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims (WDR) is commemorated on the third Sunday of November each year – to remember the many millions killed and injured on the world’s roads, together with their families, friends and the many others who are also affected. It is also an opportunity to thank the emergency services, medical professionals and others who deal daily with the traumatic aftermath of road death and injury. A day of remembrance was initiated by RoadPeace in 1993, and adopted by the United Nations as a global day in 2005.

RoadPeace is the national charity for road crash victims in the UK. We provide information and support services to people bereaved or seriously injured in road crashes and engage in evidence based policy and campaigning work to fight for justice for victims and reduce road danger. Set up in 1992 by Brigitte Chaudhry MBE whose son was killed in a road crash, we are a membership organisation whose work is informed by the needs and experiences of road crash victims.
